A partnership with Midwest Food Bank started forming in 2013 when God planted a seed in the hearts of the people in Peoria, Illinois to minister in Appalachia. A representative from Midwest visited several locations in Central Appalachia during June of 2014 and a visit to Christ's Hands ignited the relationship. Keith Barr, Director of Mennonites Central Committee's S.W.A.P program, helped bring the final pieces together in the summer of 2015. Christ's Hands received its first semi-truck load of food in December with the hopes of getting 3 to 4 trucks a year from Midwest.

Monica Scheuer, Director of Administration for Midwest Food Bank, rode along with her husband, Steve, as they delivered a trailer full of dry foods, fresh fruits and vegetables to Harlan. She said, "The whole experience was rewarding because we were keenly aware of so many families that are in hardship in the heart of coal mining country."

Surpassing expectations, the fifth truck of food arrived at Christ's Hands in August of 2016. This new partnership has enabled Christ's Hands to distribute over 100 tons of food to the needy. Working with Midwest has opened avenues for Christ's Hands to partner locally and regionally with others. Christ's Hands benefits from additional food for use in the food pantry and soup kitchen. However,

the bulk of the food from Midwest is distributed to 10 different food pantries in Bell, Harlan and Letcher counties with plans to continue this growth into Leslie county.

As this ministry has grown, so has the need to expand the infrastructure. Midwest Food Bank currently has the capacity to send Christ's Hands a semi-truck of frozen food every other month. However, Christ's Hands has stored frozen foods in donated second hand residential chest freezers, and has not had the capacity to store bulk frozen food.

In July, a 40x12 walk-in-freezer and a 12x12 walk-in-refrigerator became available for purchase. Don Parsons, a longtime community partner, was instrumental in its acquisition and set-up.

Within forty days of the decision to purchase the equipment, the funds were raised. The units are on schedule to be operational in September, preparing Christ's Hands with the capacity to receive the frozen foods from Midwest Food Bank.

With this growth comes the need for additional resources. Christ's Hands is seeking volunteers to assist 2-3 days a month in unloading and sorting the semi truck deliveries, skilled workers to keep the units operating efficiently, and funds to pay the increased maintenance cost.

This Month's Q&A



Q: How is Christ's Hands funded? And how can I begin partnering financially in the work being done?
